## OUR FARM COMPLEX



### BUILDING PROGRAM

PARCO has been sent their final payment and the new building will be complete as far as we can go and ready for the Farm Museum Festival at the end of July. Year end carryover funds has allowed us to have KW Electrical finish the electri-

cal system and with free labor from the Sprinkle Installation Union #669 has allowed us to purchase materials and have the sprinkler system installed. An anonymous donation of \$5000 towards the kitchen allows us to have the drop ceiling and floor in the kitchen prior to the festival. The timely donation of \$200 and another anonymous donation of \$300 toward the building program allowed us to extend the sound system to the new building. Installation of the hood and associated fire suppression system in the area above the kitchen ceiling (estimated at \$17,100), the kitchen cabinets, counters, equipment, etc. (estimated at \$25,000), and a second furnace to heat and provide AC in the main hall (estimated at \$7800) are put on hold until additional funding is secured.

We are happy to report that the Town of Lewiston Water Pollution Control Center has agreed and the Town of Lewiston Council has approved to waive wastewater-dumping fees at their Fletcher Road facility. Also agreed by Modern was that they will haul the wastewater from our farm to this facility, free of charge.

At this time, Gary has dissolved the building committee. He has appointed board member **Bill Sterner** to be chairman of the kitchen committee to do the planning and establish priorities for the completion of the kitchen. Working with Bill on the committee are **Fran Haskell, Linda Jackson, Joan Shaw, Paul Beecher and Wes Miller**. There is about \$2000 presently available toward the kitchen with the rest having to come from other funding. They indicated that they will get cost quotes for the different chunks of work that



has to be done and present the list to the membership for their possible help individually or collectively to complete the kitchen.

**FARM BEAUTIFICATION- Joan Shaw, Chairman (731-5653)-**

Joan with her assistant Valerie Dumpleton and other committee members have been greatly assisted by workers provided by the Sheriff's work program. This was a much needed influx of help to take care of our gardens and areas around our buildings which continue to increase with our new building program.

Hilda Snyder continues to vary the exhibits in the museum to create interest. We are now open every Sunday from 2 to 4 PM (or by special appointment by calling 731-5982).
