

#### ANNUAL ELECTION

The annual election was held at our Nov.27th meeting. Five Trustees from the five nominated were elected to the Board of Trustees. **Paul Beecher, Bob Deull, Hilda Snyder, & Gerry Treichler** were re-elected to succeed themselves for a 3-year term. We welcome new Trustee **Claudia Beane** who was also elected for a 3-year term. We thank out going Trustee **Bill Hooter** for his four years service on the board and who is now leaving for personal reasons.

Gary Townsend, Bill Read, Gerry Treichler and Glenn Wienke were re-elected as your President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, respectively. Your officers as well as the Trustees making up the Board are presented on the previous page herein.

#### **NEW BUILDING-**

Our grand new building is just about finished. The alarm system has been installed and was satisfactorily checked out during the pressure checkout of the sprinkler system on November 13. The test results were sent to the Town of Lewiston for their use during final building certification. We have been informed that the town will fund our voucher for an extra \$16,000 to allow us to complete the building. With this knowledge, we had a 2<sup>nd</sup> furnace installed to heat the 50' by 70' main hall just in time for our Old Fashion Christmas program. The associated air conditioning portion will be installed next spring. The kitchen floor, cabinets, and island are in place. The counter tops will be installed soon. We are receiving cost estimates for the installation of the necessary hood and associated fire suppression system for the kitchen that appears to be coming in within available funding. The town Building Inspector has been contacted and he and the town Fire Inspector will have a "walk-through" this January with the anticipation that we will be able to receive a partial building occupancy permit until final work is complete.

Next spring we should have completed a fine new addition to our Farm Museum. This was made possible through the vision and special

efforts of **Town of Lewiston Supervisor Steve Reiter.** He and his board secured \$260,000 through the Greenway Commission to allow them to provide a grant to fund the project with ground breaking taking place October 28, 2010.

The project is near completion under the able leadership of SAHS President Gary Townsend and his assistant Bill Sterner and the expertise of many others that helped in the planning, and securing and monitoring of the contractors and some actually performing the work needing to be done to complete the building. SAHS thanks one and all for their dedication over the past 2 years. We and the whole community are all proud of your collective accomplishments.


Basket Auction at Antique Show & Sale

#### LEGION BUILDING -

**Our Grant Writer, Bernie Rotella,** is now applying for a grant using the history package on the 187-year-old building together with estimates for moving the building approx 4300 ft from its present location on Pearl Street in Sanborn to a location on our farm as well as estimates for the new foundation and planned building modifications. **We thank Jim Ditzel** for donating his time in preparation of the necessary drawings required for moving the building modifications. Our plans are to add an entry way and steeple at the east end of the

building to form a church entrance similar to the way it looked when it was built in 1825 in Pekin. We also plan to have the west end where the present kitchen and restrooms are located at the same level as the church portion and converted for use as a veterans museum with the restrooms removed. Over the years the building serviced 5 churches as well being used as the Post Home for the Sanborn American Legion Post #969 who donated the building. GAR Post #125 was the predecessor Post to Post #969. We have a ribbon with the names of 52 area men that died while serving during the Civil War and memorialized by GAR Post #125. At that time the Post was named the **Alexander Mabon Post #125** after one of the fallen heroes.

Historical Corner by Gerald E. Treichler The following are rememberances written by RE Casselman, an early pioneer of Sanborn. He came to Sanborn in 1912 and started the Sanborn Home Telephone Co. **The year** I came to Sanborn 1912, was the last year A.L. Pearce bought buggies by the car load, he unloaded them just East of what is now Calkins Mill, and Charlie Martin put them together. It was quite a site to see fifteen or twenty of them standing along the road, and those who came to buy, would pick out the one they wanted, towing it behind the old one they came in. It is to bad there are no pictures of such events.

#### "Want to buy a duck "?

I wonder how many to-day can remember Joe Penner and his "Want to buy a duck" program on the Radio when radio was quite new.

Nearly everyone listened to Joe's Program as it was full of good clean humor and happy chatter. It gave the public many a hearty laugh.

It was too bad that Joe Penner died quite young and his program of happy good will ceased.

#### "Sleigh Bells in the Snow"

I wonder how many people can remember "back when" there were sleighs drawn by one or two horses, in winter especially at Christmas time there were bells attached to the harness or in a string around the horses, when the horse moved the bells would jingle. There were still some sleigh bells used after I came to Sanborn in 1912.

These sleigh bells were of three principle styles, Those that were mounted on a long strap that went around the horse. Hame bells that were attached to the top of the hame that extended above the horses collar and sets of bells that were attached to the underside of the thills.

Some drivers made quite a thing of securing bells of special tone or grading the bells as to size to give a more musical sound.

Some hame Bells were mounted on a frame that extended high above the hame top and were very ornamental as well as musical. Many teams of horses were very easy to identify by the sound of the bells.

There was a lot of jingle in town when ten or fifteen people drove in to shop and each rig had a set of bells, nearly all of a different tone.

When I was a small boy, away back in the 1890's, my people used candles a great deal, we ate our evening meals by candlelight, us kids used a candle to light our way to bed. Then we had oil lamps, oil lamps were still used when I came to Sanborn in 1912.

I have often wondered if it would not be a fine idea to shut off the Electric Lights and eat an evening meal by lamp or candlelight. It sure would bring home the advantage of our present day Electric lite which is now a necessity.
