

We were told that we needed to add smoke alarms, fire pull boxes and strobe lights/horns in the building prior to the receipt of an occupancy permit. We have since received a low bid of \$2356 from Buffalo Alarm to do the job. Now, after having received our board approval to go ahead and with concurrence of the proposed plan by the Town Fire Inspector, we will have this work done and be able to receive our occupancy permit.

Bill thanks his committee of Paul Beecher, Fran & Bonnie Haskell, Linda & Paul Jackson, Wes Miller, Joan Shaw, and Gerry Treichler for their part in their helping in finishing the job that included the kitchen that was allowed by the extra funding provided by the Town. - The item results in multiple duplicates or does not have significant differences from other items in the collections of **SAHS**.
- **SAHS** is unable to conserve the item in a responsible manner.
- Items are dropped off without identification of donor. An item accepted by **SAHS** is to be identified with "anonymous" as donor. Items not accepted will be discarded.
