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ANNUAL MEETING & ELECTION –

LEGION/CHURCH BUILDING-

Jay Wendt is under contract and will start construction the end of October using the revised design of the front entry way of an open porch, with a gable roof and a bell tower as shown on the drawings below. Work on the interior of the building is continuing to progress with lighting fixtures being approved by the board and a wiring diagram prepared. Now work can start on the rough wiring so that dry wall can be installed.

SALE OF LEGION PROPERTY-

The 50' x150' former Legion property on Pearl St. will soon be put on the market by SAHS. The board approve putting in the hands of a realtor for sale. It appears that the land presently accessed for \$9500 is a building lot with a tie into the Town's sewer at the rear and easy access to natural gas and electric at the front.

SCHOOLHOUSE MUSEUM- Hilda Snyder, 731-9883- Curator-

Visiting Hours at our Schoolhouse Museum will change from between 2 to 4 PM every Sunday of the month to the first Sunday of the month only for the winter months beginning Dec 6. We are planning our annual Christmas party with goodies and singing to our 100-year old pump organ at the Schoolhouse at 2 PM on that Sunday. All are invited.

About 18 years ago SAHS had the Schoolhouse donated to us by the Niagara-Wheatfield Central School District moved to our lot on Niagara Street. Then we had Boces give it a complete make over into our Schoolhouse Museum that included handicap accessibility, rest rooms



and an office. We just finished the first major work on the building since then by replacing the roof and having the work release workers paint the ramp entry way. This was an unexpected task but needed doing to protect our investment.

FARM MUSEUM, Bonnie Haskell, Curator-

Our farm museum is now closed until next Spring except by special appointment. Bonnie thanks all who have helped out at the museum and those who have donated items for our museum to make it the fine museum that it is and for your continued support. PROPOSED CHANGES TO SAHS BYLAWS

Revise- ARTICLE II SCHEDULE AND QUORUM FOR MEETINGS

ADD "December" to the first sentence- list of months with no regular meetings.

<u>DELETE</u> Last sentence "A quorum consisting of one fifth of the total general membership of the Society is needed to conduct a general monthly meeting." (This is covered in SECT VIII Roberts Rules of Order)

Revise- ARTICLE III DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND TRUSTEES

<u>DELETE</u> last sentence under <u>Corresponding Secretary-</u> "Prepare, publish, and distribute the Sanborn Area Historical Society newsletter in a timely fashion." (This is a standing committee not necessarily chaired by the Corresponding secretary.)

Replace existing- ARTICLE VII COMMITTEES with the following-

The President shall appoint chairmen of all standing committees for a period of one year. Chairmen may succeed themselves, if so appointed by the President. The President may also set up & appoint chairmen for other committees as he deems necessary. These committees with their assigned chairmen shall be listed in the January newsletter for the coming year.

The President is an ex officio member of all committees.

Officers and trustees at large may chair one or more committees.

The society shall have the following standing committees:

Collections Committee shall be responsible for collecting and cataloging artifacts, books, memorabilia, manuscripts, newspapers, pictures and other collectibles of a like nature in accordance with the collections management procedure. As a minimum, a catalog of items collected shall be maintained by this committee in note books remaining in the office of the museum secretary. The catalogue shall be prepared using an appropriate computer program with files regularly backed up and secured in at least 2 locations. Data included shall be donors name and address, date received, description and picture of the item, estimated date or period for the item, member receiving donation and disclaimer from donor concerning use.

Museum Curators shall be in charge of the Sanborn Area Historical Society schoolhouse and farm museums and shall plan and create displays periodically to present the history of the Sanborn area to our members and the visiting public, using artifacts and materials collected by the society or borrowed from others for a special display. They shall be responsible for care and any necessary repair of items in the collection.

Publications Committee shall be responsible for publishing a quarterly newsletter with inputs from the president, museum curators and various chairmen and having the newsletter mailed to the membership and selected dignitaries in a timely manner. This committee shall also be responsible for working with the Web Master to maintain the SAHS web site.

Program Committee shall be responsible for arranging for entertainment and suitable refreshments at the 8 monthly meetings of the general membership. This committee shall consist of a minimum of three members selected by and including, the chairman.

Membership Committee shall be responsible for preparing and providing the annual membership cards for paying members, sending reminder notices to delinquent members, conducting membership drives and for processing new candidates for membership.

Ways and Means Committee shall devise ways and means programs to provide finances for the Sanborn Area Historical Society to supplement funds received from the Town of Lewiston. After presentation to the Board of Trustees, this committee shall be responsible for implementing the programs as presented and approved by the trustees and listed in the January newsletter.

Financial/Audit Committee shall prepare the budget for the following year for board of Trustees approval at their August board meeting of the previous year. This will be presented to the Town of Lewiston for the purpose of securing a contract for funding the museums operation. This committee shall secure 2 members to audit the books of the Treasurer when deemed necessary.

Nominating Committee shall be responsible for preparing a list of candidates for office, and trustees at large and presenting their names to the Board of Trustees for consideration. These candidates shall be presented in the October newsletter and subsequently presented at the November annual meeting for possible election.
