We also thank Bill Read, Fran Haskell, Gary Townsend, Paul Calkins, Joan Shaw, Glenn Wienke, and Gerry Treichler and others who monitored the Sheriff Department workers and provided information and materials needed to get the job done The outfitting of the hall is on hold until we receive funding. Town Supervisor Steve Broderick has indicated that this year's allotment from the relicensing of the Power Authority has been filled by other needs. Other sources of funding are being looked into.

SAHS NEEDS YOUR HELP FOR DEBT REDUCTION

SAHS had the unexpected debt of \$40,000 in 2016 for construction of our new storage building. Our storage greenhouses were destroyed due to the winter storm. Time limitations did not allow us to seek grant funding. We are presently paying \$300 per month or \$3600 annually to pay off this debt. This, together with the decreasing support from the Town of Lewiston for the last 2 years of \$4100 left each vear treasurer Glenn Wienke scrambling for funds to pay the bills earlier this year. He had to transfer funds from our small savings account to help pay them until funds were received. from our dues

and other sources.

AT THIS TIME WE HAVE AN ANONYMOUS DONOR THAT HAS OFFERED \$5000 AS MATCHING FUNDS FOR EACH DONATION BY OTHERS TO PAY OFF THE \$10,700 OUT STANDING DEBT remaining on the Storage Building. This means that with the \$1000 that Gerald Treichler has donated for debt reduction, our debt will be reduced by \$2000 resulting in \$8700 still owed. When completely paid off, SAHS will have \$3600 more annually to help pay its bills. If there are donor funds left over after paying off the storage building, they will go into our savings account as a safeguard in case of other such emergencies. PLEASE PROVIDE WHAT EVER YOU CAN CON-TRIBUTE TO THIS FUND TO HELP US REMAIN SOLVENT.
