BUILDING COMMITTEE.- Paul Calkins, Chair (471-4422)

Work on the Treichler Building continues to make sure we do not get mold on the many artifacts in place in the building. Estimates are being gathered for a ductless system to provide heating, air conditioning and a dehumidify control to prevent mold from forming. Further research is being done. Before any unit could be installed, the ceiling would have to be insulated. John Gross will be consulted regarding this project.

Sewer Update The Town will soon have the main sewer trunk line pushed under Rt. 31. When the Town is done, then SAHS will have a contractor switch the sewer line from the sewage holding tank to the new sewer line to the road.

A solar-powered light will be installed in the spring to light the area where our driveway enters Saunders Settlement Road.

FARM LANDSCAPE & CONSERVATION:

Our dedicated garden committee volunteers, headed by **Joan Shaw** have created and maintained series of gardens to enhance the grounds and the nearby buildings at the Farm. For many summers they added lively sparks of color and soft natural touches to the landscape for visitors to enjoy.

is looking for a new chairperson to oversee the planting of annual flower beds and work with Bill Read to supervise the maintenance of perennials, shrubs and trees.

The garden committee will meet at 3:00 PM on Wednesday, April 17th, at the School House Museum. This meeting is open to anyone interested in helping to keep our gardens beautiful. Bring your ideas and concerns. We will discuss gardening plans for the summer.

Joan has indicated that she is willing to continue to work with others to take care of the area around the pond. She is also willing to continue to take part in the Memorial Tree Program. The most recent purchase of a tree is In Memory of Gilbert & Marjorie (Treichler) Hedden.

FARM MUSEUM FESTIVAL, July 27 & 28, Bonnie Haskell (990-6909) – Chairperson




