### 25th ANNIVERSARY OF SANBORN AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The **Sanborn Area Historical Society (SAHS)** brings to life the history of the rural, historic, Sanborn area. **Formed in 1996,** its first project was to move the one-room West Street Schoolhouse onto land purchased from the CSX Railroad near the Sanborn Public Library. Since that time, the school has been converted into a first class museum complete with handicap accessibility.

In 2002, SAHS purchased the 56-acre Wienke farm with its **100-year old vintage Barn**. In 2006, SAHS erected our 4200 sq ft **Les Read Memorial Museum**. The **Gary Townsend Hall**, an activities and support facility, was completed in 2014. The Treichler Building, formerly known as the Church-Legion Building was completed 2018. This building was donated by the Sanborn American Legion Post 969; moved on location on the SASH Farm; and modified to replicate a church like it was in Pekin in 1826.

#### ANNUAL ELECTION 2021 WLR

Since our January 2021 Newsletter, Lynn Hoffman has resigned from the board of Trustees and Ron Craft has been nominated to replace her. All those nominated as officers and nominated trustees for open positions will be up for election at our next regular meeting at the Sanborn Fire Hall. This meeting is yet to be scheduled.

#### SOLAR PANALS

The **Town of Lewiston** has recently approved their Solar Energy System Local Law and lifted their moratorium on new solar Energy Projects in Town of Lewiston. The SAHS Board has approved the final lease agreement with **Borrego** and it has been signed. **Borrego** is finalizing the solar panel layout that we

agreed upon. Once the layout is finalized, **Borrego** will prepare the engineering information and this data will be presented to the **Town of Lewiston** for approval of our Solar Project.




#### WORK PROGRAM - Gary Townsend Chmn (Ph 523-0753)




Royal T. Levan Store, Sanborn - built in 1910. Later, the name was changed to R. T. LeVan and Sons. The store was one of the principal businesses of Sanborn, handling groceries, hardware, plumbing, heating and electrical contracting. It is now the Sanborn Old General Store. 
Sanborn Cheese Factory. When built in 1867 by a group of farmers, this building was the largest building west of Albany and produced 56,000 pounds of cheese in 1876. Over the years the building had various uses. Pioneer Settler Ralph E. Casselman established the Sanborn Home Telephone Company in the building in 1912. It now exists as an apartment house. 
**Sanborn Exchange Hotel,** Built in 1909 after the previous smaller structure was destroyed by fire. Since that time, the structure has under gone several modifications and is now known as the Marlboro Inn. {Sketch by Donna Aiken)



**1876 Sketch of Samuel Treichler Farm, Sanborn, N.Y.,** Established in 1856. It now exists as two houses across from and just north of the entrance to NCCCC on Townline Road. In 1833, Samuel (age 7) came to Ward Road Sanborn with his father, Daniel and family as pioneer settlers from York, Pa.




Sanborn Public School. The two-story structure was built in 1884 at the corner of West Street and Route 31 and seated 50 to 60 students. It was replaced when an arson fire destroyed the original structure in 1943.



Sanborn Methodist Church, Buffalo and Tallman Streets. The corner stone was laid in 1872 by Israel Sanborn and Carlos Beecher. This 1904 picture shows the Sunday School leaving by horse drawn wagons for the Ward Road Trolley to be taken to Buffalo for the boat trip to Crystal Beach for a picnic.



Rhoney Funeral Home, Hoover Road, Sanborn, N.Y. The house was built in 1892 for the Joseph Shenk family. In 1946 William J. Pike purchased the house for use as a Funeral Home and the name was later changed to Pike and Jones. The Rhoney's have operated this as a funeral home since 1967. (Sketch by Donna Aiken.)



"Doc" Woodworth's Gas Station with the NY Central Train Depot and Marlboro Inn, Sanborn, N.Y. "Doc" (Addison) Woodworth operated the gas station in the 1940's through 1970's. Earlier he was horse and buggy driver and then a Model-T driver for Doctor Peart; thus the nickname "Doc."
